Israel's Latest War Crime in Gaza Fails to Break Palestinian Spirit of Resistance

Despite the carnage, the killing of children, the destruction of all public buildings in Gaza as well as universities and mosques that lasted for four days, all signs indicate that Israel has squarely

failed to break the Palestinian spirit of resisting the oppressive occupier.

Hamas has vowed to fight the Israeli aggressors and defend its people in Gaza. It said it is preparing for fighting a possible

Israeli ground attack.

Despite winter rain, which could impede a ground operation in the Gaza Strip, Israeli warplanes attacked Palestinian targets for a fourth day, killing 15 Palestinians. In

Beit Hanoun, in northern Gaza, two Palestinian sisters were killed in an air raid near their home, medical workers said.

Medical officials put Palestinian casualties since the aerial onslaught began on

Saturday at 384 dead and more than 1750 wounded. Barak's office said he would seek Israeli cabinet approval for the mobilization of 2,500 military reservists. The cabinet had

Libya Demands Swiss Authorities to Punish those Responsible for Violating Rights of Libyan Diplomats, Pay Compensation

Libya is demanding not only an apology from Swiss authorities but also the punishment of those who arrested Hannibal Muammar Gaddafi in Geneva last July.

"The Swiss authorities in the first days following the arrest already said they are ready to apologise," said Libyan deputy foreign minister for European Affairs, Abdulati al-Obeidi.

"But what we want first is that justice is done and that the people responsible are punished," Obeidi told a news conference in Tripoli.

He said a joint legal committee had been formed by the two countries to inquire into the circumstances of the arrest of Hannibal and his wife on July 15 in Geneva.

Obeidi stressed that Libya's demands were based on the results of the inquiry and "the facts."

In a statement distributed at a press conference, Libya demanded that the Swiss
