WIPL Holds Fifth General Conference to Review Challenges Facing Muslims

Tripoli- Hundreds of Muslim participants have flocked Libya's capital Tripoli to attend the 5th General Conference of World Islamic People's Leadership-WIPL.

This year's conference features the title of a WIPL 2008-2009 released documentary book entitled: The World Islamic Leadership: 20 Years Serving Muslims in this Era.

The conference organized by the World Islamic Call Society whose theme is derived from the verse of the holy Qur'an, reads: "Let there arise out of you a band of people inviting to all that is

good."

The three-day conference whose principle objective was to draw a wide range of subjects and raise awareness on the issues touching the Muslim ummah began on November 5.

The opening was held at the Da'awa Islamic College while the remaining days of the

conference were held at Dat al Imad complex.

According to the organizers of the conference, the Islamic Leadership is to deal with issues that are of concern to Muslims at the local level and those at the level of the Islamic world relations' with others.

Zionist Settlers Evict Palestinians from Al-Quds

Zionist settlers forced their way into a Palestinian house in East Jerusalem on Tuesday, using hired armed people to humiliate and evict an elderly Palestinian woman, 28 more people and tossing their belongings into the rain-swept yard.

The settlers displayed what they said was a Zionist court order granting them ownership of the simple one-story building. Human rights groups said the

takeover was a push by Jewish settlers to expand their presence in East Jerusalem.

This is happening in the holy Al-Aqsa land as Muslim leaders keep on holding conferences and meetings without undertaking practical steps to end the tears of Palestinian elderly and children being evicted from their homes on daily basis.

Israel captured the area in the 1967 war and immediately

annexed it - a move recognized by no other country.

Palestinians consider East Jerusalem the capital of their hoped-for state. Palestinians clashed with the Jewish settlers after they took over the building, and police intervened to protect the settlers who overtaken the premises by force.

Similar Zionist aggressions have taken place in recent weeks.
