Gaddafi to FAO Summit: those Who Robbed Our Wealth can Run but Cannot Hide

Speaking on behalf of the African Union at The three-day World Food Summit organised

by the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in Rome, the President of the AU

Muammar Gaddafi said "it is regrettable that the rich did not attend this conference. It is a

clear message to all of us that the rich have decided not to contribute to the solution of the world food security."

But he also said that those who stole the Third World's wealth could run but could not hide. "The pursuit is ongoing of those who robbed our wealth, whether they attended this

conference or they did not. We will continue to demand them and pursue them. Time is endless," Gaddafi stressed.

The President of the AU said: "We are not begging them and we are not beggars. We are demanding a right that has been usurped."

Algeria Qualify for 2010 World Cup, Amid Joyful Scenes at Home and Abroad

Algerians and those supporting the North African

country in Algeria itself and the Arab/African world exploded

with joy as their football team managed to qualify to the finals of the 2010 World Cup in South Africa by virtue of a 1-0 victory in a play-off match in Khartoum, Sudan.

The victory earned Algeria qualification the finals for the first time in 24 years, since 1986, and also avenged their defeat and elimination by Egypt 20 years ago, almost to the day, from the 1990 World Cup.

As a result, Algeria joins Ghana, Cameroon, Ivory Coast, Nigeria and hosts South Africa as the six representatives from the African in the next June's World Cup.
