## Libya Summons US Ambassador, Strongly Protests Inclusion on Air Security Watch List

Tripoli- Libya has strongly protested against the US decision to include the country on the list of 14 countries whose nationals would undergo a systematic check before boarding a plane to the US.

The Secretary of the General People's Committee for Foreign Liaison and International

Cooperation (GPCFLIC), Moussa Koussa summoned on Wednesday morning the US ambassador in Tripoli Gene Cretz to strongly protest against the American decision.

In response, the US ambassador explained that Libya had nothing to do with the decision and its inclusion on the

list does in no way mean that the US government re-enlisted Libya among countries sponsoring terrorism.

The Libyan news agency JANA quoted Cretz as saying that "such issue is over and decisions had already been taken in its regard."

"Not all countries on the list

are sponsors of terrorism and that the US government believes that extremist movements used to exist in these countries and now are being monitored as not to enter the US," Cretz said as quoted by JANA.

Koussa warned the American ambassador that regardless of his explanations and justifications regarding the American decision towards Great Jamahiriya, Libya will

## Libya to Implement Its Peaceful Nuclear Energy Program, Assisted by Eastern, Western Powers

Libya has announced that it is embarked to activate agreements with various countries aimed at implementing a peaceful nuclear energy program that has been under study for a number of years.

The Libyan Nuclear Energy Corporation (NEC) said agreements concluded with

France, Argentina, Ukraine, the Russian Federation and Canada along with several other enterprises specialised in the construction of atomic reactors for power generation and water desalination are now to be contacted in order to put the program into action.

The ambitious Libyan plan is expected to provide huge

business opportunities to countries and firms that are specialized in peaceful nuclear energy projects.

The chairman of NEC, Dr. Ali Mohamed Ghachout, said Wednesday that a series of provisions have been identified to start the national nuclear
